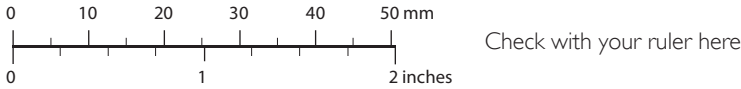

Size up your finger (Australian & UK sizing)

Firstly, it's essential that your print out is correct. Ensure you print this page at 100% with no scaling. If your ruler and print don't match exactly, please check your printer settings. We also suggest using a couple of the methods below to ensure you have found your accurate size.



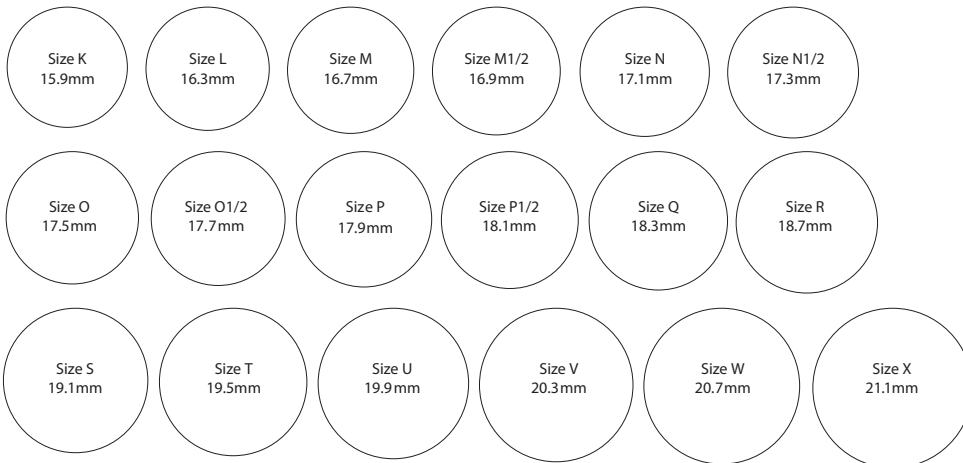
Method 1: Measure your finger with a paper sizer

1. Carefully cut along the outline of the sizer. Make a small slit in the left end of the sizer.
2. Wrap the sizer around the intended finger with the letters facing out.
3. Slide the pointed end of the sizer through the slit.
5. Move the sizer to the largest/widest part of the finger, this may be the knuckle.
6. Pull firmly. The sizer must fit snugly to produce an accurate size.
7. The letter that lines up at the slit represents the ring size for that finger.



Method 2: Measure against another one of your rings

1. Take a ring with a similar band width that already fits the finger you want to measure
2. Place the ring over the circles below, matching the inside edge of the ring to the outer edge of the circle nearest in size. This measurement is the diameter of the ring.
3. If the ring falls between two sizes, order the larger size.



Method 3: Head down to your local jeweller

Still need a helping hand or want to be absolutely sure?
Visit your jeweller to have your finger sized with a ring with a similar band width.

Take note of the band width!

Please keep in mind that a ring with a band width over 5mm, generally means you will need to go up in size.

You may notice that if you already own rings that vary in band widths, the rings with the wider bands probably have a greater diameter measurement than your thinner rings.

It is always best to measure against a ring you already have at home. It helps if it has a similar band width to the description of the ring you would like to purchase to ensure you get the perfect fit and if you are inbetween sizes, it is best to get the larger size.

Measurement descriptions

In each ring description, we may mention words such as 'feature-side' and 'bottom'. Or when we are describing our measurements, we sometimes use words including 'band-width' and 'height'.

Refer to the diagram below to double check you have an accurate idea of the sizing and measurements.
